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# <u>A</u>

#### **Absences**

If your child will be absent from school, please call the school office before 8:00 a.m. at 566-2922 and let them know.

#### Admission

## <u>Arrival</u>

Students should not arrive before 7:30 a.m. and are not allowed in the classroom before 7:50 a.m. The school's lobby doors will open at 7:30 a.m. and students are to go to the cafeteria where they will be supervised by a teacher on duty. School officially begins at 8:00 a.m.

## **Attendance**

Please try to make sure your child is at school each and every day. This helps them with overall academic success and aids them into a school routine.

#### **Backpacks**

As part of our school supplies, please send your child to school with a backpack large enough to fit a folder.

## **Birthdays**

Birthdays are a very special time for children! If you would like to send in treats for your child's birthday, please let us know a few days in advance so we can plan accordingly. Summer birthdays will be celebrated on or near their half birthday. Birthday invitations may ONLY be handed out at school if all children

(or all of the same gender) in the classroom receive an invitation.

#### Blue Folders

In Pre-K, returning your child's blue folder each and every day is important. Not only does this get them in a daily routine, but it also allows papers and notes to go home easily.

## Calendar

#### Classrooms

Our Pre-K Classrooms are located downstairs. The first Pre-K classroom is located on the right across the hall from the Science Lab. The other Pre-K classroom is located straight ahead down the hall and across from the Kindergarten classroom.

## Child Protection Training

Before a parent/grandparent etc. can volunteer in the classroom/school or attend a field trip, he/she must attend an Initial Child Protection Training course. Every year thereafter requires a refresher course.

#### Christmas Program

The HCS band / Christmas program is held in December. The Pre-K Class does NOT participate in this.

#### Class Books

Throughout the year, we will be making class books to go along with our thematic units or Letter of the Week. We will send home each book so every family has a chance to view them.

## Class Dojo

This is an app based behavior system we use to reward and reinforce student's behavior.

## Class Size

There will be a maximum of 18 students for the Pre-K class. That will be a combination of MWF  $\frac{1}{2}$  day children, MWF full day children and M-F full day children.

#### Conferences

Parent teacher conferences will be held in November and in the spring.

#### Curriculum

The religion curriculum we will use is "Allelu!". Our academic curriculum is based around the Letter of the Week and incorporates Houghton Mifflin's Pre-K Program. See our class website for specific information.

## Family Homework Projects

#### Homework

No real homework will be given. However, there may be times when a Family Homework Project will be assigned. Please work at home with your child on practicing to write their first names and holding their pencil and crayons correctly. Please practice—cutting, coloring, and gluing as well. For Math, have your child count objects, identify shapes, and make patterns with 2 objects or colors. The most important thing to do with your child is read to them daily! While reading, you can discuss the story and illustrations, as well as look for letters and talk about those letter sounds.

## Leader of the Day

In Pre-K, instead of having several job helpers for a given day, we have implemented a Leader of the Day. This person is responsible for taking papers to the office, leading us in calendar and weather, being the line leader, and helping out in other ways as deemed necessary.

#### Learning Centers

Participating in learning centers is a central part of our curriculum. Our centers include: reading, math, writing, art, blocks, and dramatic play. Other centers such as water and science will be added as needed.

## Lunch

There is a hot lunch program at HCS that is offered ONLY for our full day students. A nutritious lunch is served every day. Students may buy lunches a day at a time, but it is easier to pay ahead of time. All lunch account information is available through our online communication system:

#### <u>Parties</u>

We will have 4 classroom parties/fun center days: Halloween, Christmas, Valentine's Day and Easter/Alleluia Parties. Sign up for the parties is held at Open House in August or within the first few weeks of school. The Pre-K room parent will then notify the parents what they signed up to bring.

## Picking Up Your Child

When picking up your HALF DAY STUDENT, you may park in the parking lot. You will then need to enter under the blue canopy by first pressing the button to your right. Mrs. Fohne will then buzz the door for you to enter. You can proceed directly to your child's classroom; you do not have to

## sign in at the office.

When picking up your FULL DAY STUDENT, you may park on the parking lot, but please not in the front row. Doing so blocks the children's view of the cars on the lot making it unsafe. It is also a good idea to pick up your child prior to 3:00 p.m., (2:45 p.m.) as it will be easier for you to leave without the rest of the school being dismissed at the same time.

#### **Priority List**

HCS Preschool has established a priority list for registration availability. The following list will be put into action if the class is at maximum capacity.

#### Recess

All students will have a morning recess either on the playground or gym; those who attend full day, will also have a recess in the afternoon.

#### Registration

Pre-K registration forms begin to be available at the spring Open House & Registration night.

#### Rest Time

For the full day students, a rest time of about 1 hour and 30 minutes is given. A nap mat is

required for all full time students. If he/she would also like to bring in a small blanket to

cover up with or a small "friend" to snuggle with, that is fine; however we do not have the space in our classroom to store these items.

So if your child wishes to bring these, they must stay in his/her backpack. For those students not napping, they are allowed to look at books while quietly lying on their mat.

## Room Parent

This parent is responsible for contacting parents who have signed up for bringing in items for the parties. He /she will also work with the teacher to help plan and coordinate the Pre-K Field Day in May.

## Rules

Our classroom rules include: helping hands, looking eyes, listening ears, quiet voices, walking feet, and loving hearts.

Each spring the 8<sup>th</sup> grade class hosts a variety show with a given theme. Each class is then required to come up with a dance to perform that evening. The Pre-K Classes will be participating in this. Arrive at least 30 minutes prior to get a good seat.

## **Visitors**

During school hours, visitors to HCS are admitted to the school through the west school entrance only. All entrances are locked. To be admitted, press the button on the intercom/microphone box at the west entrance and someone in the office will release the door lock. Proceed directly to the school office upon entering the building. Visitors are asked to sign in and to wear a visitor's badge.

#### Volunteers

Volunteers are always welcome and needed, however, all volunteers MUST attend an Initial Child Protection Training class or refresher course. Volunteers are needed in the classroom, attending field trips, as room parents, or as classroom volunteers to read or work with the children.

Throughout the school volunteers are needed in the cafeteria, library, and for playground duty.
