## **Thanksgiving Community Project**

"Instead of each person watching out for their own good, watch out for what is better for others." PHILIPPIANS 2:4

The students and faculty of HCS will be gathering Thanksgiving meal items and donating them to the Mascoutah Food Pantry. To accomplish this act of service, we will be hosting a dress down day for donations on Friday, Nov 5th. The donations will be used to purchase perishable items and other food items needed at the food pantry. Additionally, we will be collecting Thanksgiving non-perishable items at school from Nov 5th-12th. The following are examples of items (canned vegetables, yams, pumpkin, cranberry sauce; stuffing; chicken or other broths; cream soups; boxed dessert items; pumpkin pie items; boxed potato casserole; instant potatoes; gravy mixes; etc)



## Safe and Sacred

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, as well as our Diocesan Child Protection Policy, requires that all Catholic Schools and Parish School of Religion Programs offer to children (PreK to grade 12) within those programs, an age-appropriate presentation addressing issues of body safety. This program is also incompliance with Erin's Law regarding sexual abuse prevention.

Beginning the first week of November 2021, we will be utilizing the Safe and Sacred Children's Program to provide this information to your child's class. The presentation is age-appropriate and deals with the issue of sexual abuse. It stresses the importance that your child's body belongs to them and if anyone touches them in a way that makes them feel uncomfortable, they should #1: Tell them NO! STOP!, #2: Move away to a safe place, and #3: Tell an adult they trust. The main goal of the presentation is to teach children ways to keep their body safe. As age increases, topics of Internet Safety, Boundaries, Bullying/Cyberbullying and Grooming are introduced. A packet will be sent home to you after the session so that you can continue the conversation. These sessions will be taught by Mrs. Cozzi for grades Preschool – grade 4 and Mrs. Renth for grades 5-8.

## **Empower Illinois**

Invest in Kids Act was a law which provided up to \$100 million in scholarships for children. Empower Illinois' scholarships provide opportunities for families to apply for tuition assistance. We are extremely fortunate at HCS to have about twelve individuals donate last year, which raised a little over \$30,000. With an anonymous matching donation from a catholic family in northern Illinois, HCS was able to support numerous families with tuition for the 2021-2022 school year. Thank you donors!

Donations for the 2022-2023 school year begin December 1. Donors who give to Empower Illinois receive a 75% state tax credit for the amount of their gift, up to \$1 million. In addition, any portion of the tax credit may be carried forward for up to five years. Donors are able to select Holy Childhood School as the place to receive the donation.
